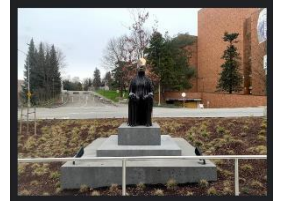

The University of Washington is in the city of Seattle, and accessible from SeaTac airport (Seattle-Tacoma International Airport). We are in the University District of the city (the U-District). The airport is about 25-30 minute drive or Uber/Lyft ride from the University campus, or about 1 hour by light rail (Central Link Light Rail, by Sound Transit). The University is often referred to as U-Dub (short for U W).

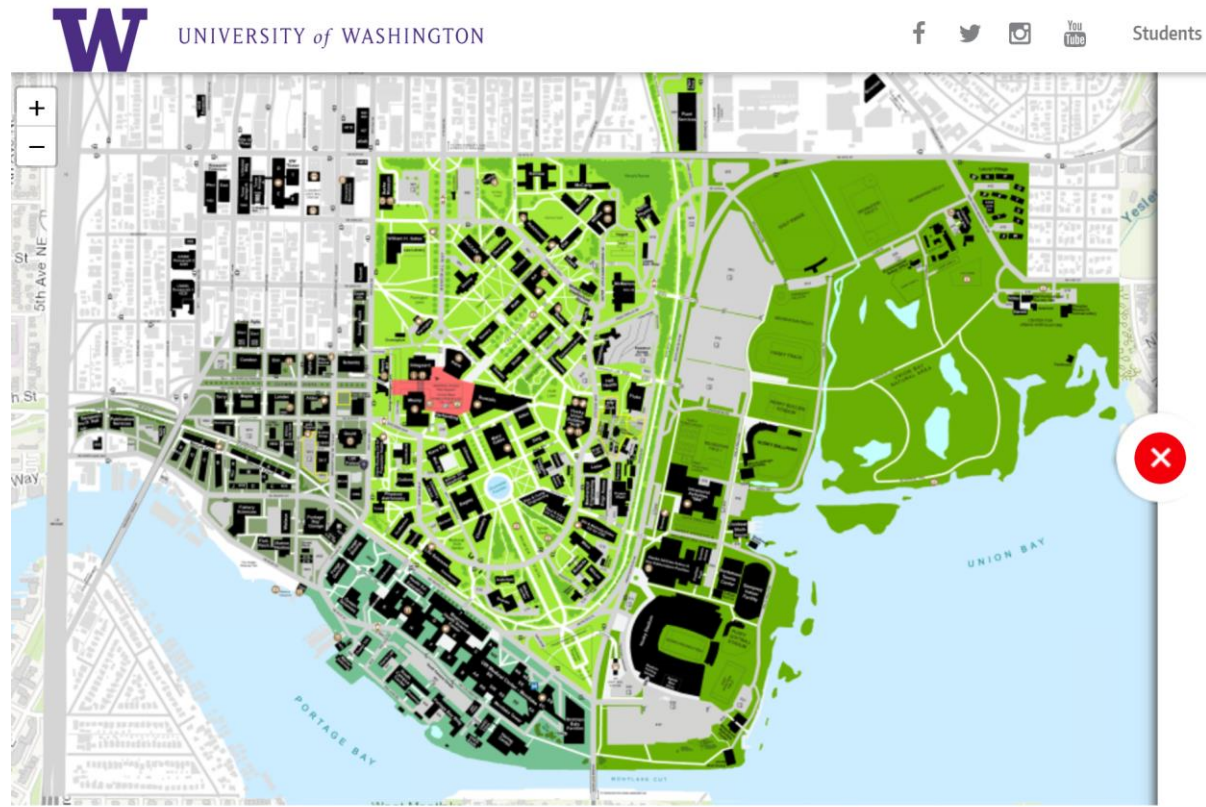
Public transit to the UW campus

- **By air:** [Sea-Tac International Airport](#) serves Seattle and is about 30 minutes from campus by car (during heavy traffic, this may take up to an hour) or about 45 minutes by light rail.
- **By Link light rail:** The UW [Link light-rail](#) stops at Husky Stadium, a 1 hour ride from Sea-Tac International Airport. It is about a 15 minute walk from the Husky Stadium to Gould Hall, across the campus. One stop after Husky Stadium is the U-District, which is about 4 blocks north of Gould Hall on University Avenue.

From Interstate 5 (I-5), northbound: Important: Do not use the I-5 express lanes. Take exit 169 (NE 45th St.) toward NE 45th St. // Turn east on NE 45th St. // Turn right on 15th Ave. NE and continue to NE 41st St. The entrance to the Central Plaza Parking Garage is on the left.

Gould Hall (GLD)

Gould Hall is the main building for the College of Built Environments, built in 1971. It is named after Carl F. Gould, founder and first chair of the Department of Architecture. Carl Gould was a high profile architect in the northwest who contributed directly to the iconic architecture style of many original buildings on campus, such as Suzzallo Library and buildings in the Liberal Arts Quadrangle.
